Every year the Youth Choir goes on a Spring tour, and this year the tour includes concerts in Boston, MA; Cromwell, CT; New York City, NY; North Haledon, NJ; Colts Neck, NJ; Annapolis, MD; Midlothian, VA; Raleigh, NC.

Jody Schnell is the Director for the choir, and she has a performance degree in voice from the University of Oklahoma and an M.A. in Music and Worship Leadership from The Baptist College of Florida. Jody has many years of experience directing choirs in the community. She has directed the Pro Arte Chorale of Northwest Florida and presently serves as the choral director at Mosley High School and at First Presbyterian Church in Panama City.

Eric Schrotenboer is also director and accompanist, and he is a composer and classically trained pianist (Hope College). Eric writes and records scores for movies and documentaries, and he works part-time for the Christian Associates, a church planting mission work (www.christianassociates.org) and attends Denver Seminary (concentration in Messianic Judaism). His music has been featured in more than 40 films and commercials, including Focus on the Family's "That the World May Know", a teaching series shot on location throughout the middle east comprising over 30 half hour episodes.
