The Bay County Christian Youth Choir's 43 singers come from all area high schools and numerous home schools and from more than 22 different churches in Bay County representing many different denominations. Every Monday night during the school year the 8th-12th grade choir rehearses, eats and studies the Bible together. Every year the Youth Choir goes on a Spring tour, and past tours have been to California, Arizona, Michigan, Illinois, Canada, New York, Massachusetts and North Carolina.

This year the tour includes concerts in Memphis, TN; Wichita, KS; Dodge City, KS; Colorado Springs, CO; Clayton, NM; San Angelo, TX; San Antonio, TX; Fairhope, AL; and Panama City, FL. Jody Schnell is the Director for the choir, and she has a performance degree in voice from the University of Oklahoma and an M.A. in Music and Worship Leadership from The Baptist College of Florida. Jody has many years of experience directing choirs in the community. She has directed the Pro Arte Chorale of Northwest Florida and presently serves as the choral director at Mosley High School and at First Presbyterian Church in Panama City.

Stacey A. Holliday is the Accompanist for the choir, a concert pianist and a gifted mezzo-soprano with significant performance credentials spanning the past ten years. She received her master of Music degree from the School of Music at the University of South Carolina. She then earned a Graduate Certificate from this institution. She held a Graduate Assistantship in opera at USC and studied piano with Dr. Marina Lomazov. She has earned a Bachelor of Music degree from Furman University, where she studied with Dr. Derek Parsons. She served as a member of the piano faculty at Camp encore/Coda in Sweden, Maine. Additional awards include winning first prize in the 2006 USC piano concerto competition and receiving Honorable Mention in the 2005 MTNA Steinway Young Artists Competition at the state level. In the summer of 2005, Ms. Holliday was selected to attend the Second Annual Piano Masterclass in Varna, Bulgaria. Her orchestral performances include appearances with the South Carolina Philharmonic Orchestra and Furman University Symphony Orchestra, the latter a result of winning Furman's biennial concerto competition. Ms. Holliday was awarded a teaching fellowship through the Furman Advantage program, serving as a music theory teaching assistant. Additionally, Ms. Holliday has extensive vocal experience. In June of 2011 she was featured as the mezzo-soprano soloist for a performance J.S. Bach's Magnificent. Other solo vocal performances with orchestra include Handel's Messiah, Durufle's Requiem, Mozart's Requiem, Handel's Paukenmesse, and Mendelssohn's Elijah. Ms. Holliday is currently the director of Choirs at Holy Nativity Episcopal Church and music teacher at Holy Nativity Episcopal School in Panama City, Florida.
