The *Bay County Christian Youth Choir* is a non-denominational independent youth choir, and its singers come from over 15 different churches in the Panama City area in Bay County, Florida, representing many different denominations. The choir is made up of students 8th through 12th grade with a few alumni college interns serving as singers and chaperones. The choir practices every Monday night, and after practice the choir has a meal and Bible study. The choir performs in local churches and other places in the community.

For its "On Beauty" program, the choir will be focusing on biblical teachings about how God has designed us to pursue and enjoy his beauty so that we might know about his character, attributes and work in the world. The Tour theme will be amplified through narratives and Bible verses that tie the songs together celebrating God's beauty, the beauty of the church, and the beauty of each other as we reflect God's beauty to the world. The choir will explore this theme further with teaching DVDs on the bus and evening Bible studies when the choir is not performing. The Bay County Christian Youth Choir, Inc., an independent interdenominational youth choir, is established under the conviction that the future of congregational participation in the music of the church lies in the training and nurturing of its youth and children. The choir has the goals of teaching choir members (i) to speak and sing in public, (ii) the experience of performing locally and on choir tours, (iii) how to work together to achieve goals that can only be achieved collectively, (iv) the discipline of making a long-term commitment and the rewards of hard work,(v) how to "get along" with fellow choir members and (vi) skills that enable the choir members to be what God has called us all to be: worshipers of Him.

Every year the Youth Choir goes on tour, and this year the tour consists of 12 concerts in Nashville, Tennessee; Zeeland, Michigan; Holland, Michigan; Traverse City, Michigan; Mackinac Island, Michigan; Cedarville, Michigan; Memphis, Tennessee; Columbus, Mississippi; Montgomery, Alabama; Panama City, Florida.

Jody Schnell is the Director for the choir, and she has a performance degree in voice from the University of Oklahoma. Jody has many years of experience directing choirs in high school and serves as the music director at First Presbyterian Church and the Pro Arte Chorale of Northwest Florida.

Eric Schrotenboer is also director and accompanist, and he is a composer and pianist, most recently writing scores for movies and documentaries and working part-time for the Christian Associates, a church planting mission work (www.christianassociates.org). His music has been featured in more than 40 films and commercials, including Focus on the Family's "That the World May Know", a teaching series shot on location throughout the middle east comprising over 30 half hour episodes.
